
# <u>Learning Plan Week # 4 (April 27- May 1)</u>


Monday 20 minutes of reading  Focus- get your mouth ready for the first part of the word.  Kids AZ: Kids Login	Tuesday 20 minutes of reading  Focus- find all the sight words you know before reading.  https://www.kidsa-z.com/main/Login	Wednesday 20 minutes of reading  Focus- look for parts that you know in tricky or bigger words- (ing, s, at, to) https://www.kidsa-z.com/main/Login	Thursday 20 minutes of reading  Focus- talk about the beginning, middle and ending of the story.  https://www.kidsa-z.com/main/Login	Friday 20 minutes of reading  Focus- go back to re-read the sentence if it doesn't make sense or you notice you made a mistake.  https://www.kidsa-z.com/main/Login
Writing: Free write - choose a topic you would like to write about.  Focus- tell your story out loud to a parent or brother/sister before you begin writing. This will help build your ideas and make it clear what you are going to write.	Writing idea: write a letter to one of your friends/classmates. Tell them about what you've been doing and about what you miss from school.  Focus-work on having both capital and lowercase letters of appropriate sizes.	Writing: Free write - choose a new/different topic you would like to write about.  Focus-try to write a story with a beginning, middle and ending.	Writing idea: write a story about your favourite toy.  Focus- add lots of details. Why is it your favourite? Where did you get it? What does it do? What do you do with it? Who gave it to you? And any other details you can add.	20 minutes of writing  Writing: Free write - choose a new topic you would like to write about  Focus- make sure there are good finger spaces between your words. Take a look at a book to remind you what a good sized finger space looks like.

Say/write down 2 and 2, show 4 on the ten-frame, use a domino that shows 4 etc.  Gr. Primary students work with sets 0-20.	Show More/Less:  Gr. P say/add some objects on the ten-frame to show a number that is more or less than a given number.  Gr. 1 say/show a number on the ten-frames that is 1 or 2 more or 1 or 2 less than a given number  Sample 10 Frame provided	Matching Sets to Numbers:  Using a number line, point to a number and have your child make a set to match the number. Mental Math - how many different combinations make nine? (1 and 8, 2 and 7, 3 and 6)	Mental Math - count backwards from 5, 10 or 20 as you walk, jump, skip, march, or go up the stairs.
